Dear Friends

This month we move toward the high point of the Christian year, with the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. Our worship schedule is as follows:

Sunday, April 6 -- We join in the sacrament of **Communion** at all three worship hours. At the 10:30 service, our **Collegiate Ringers** will share an extended **prelude** – plan to arrive by 10:20!

Sunday, April 13 – Palm Sunday. At the 10:30 service, children join in a *palm parade* at the start of the worship hour (children wishing to participate should gather in Pierson Hall prior to the start of the service). The Children's Choir will sing.

Maundy Thursday, April 17 – Communion and Tenebrae Service (service of shadows) at 7:30pm. This powerful service follows the Last Supper and the events of Jesus' arrest and crucifixion. The Sanctuary Choir will sing.

Sunday, April 20 – Easter. I will be preaching as usual at all three worship hours:

8:30 – Sanctuary Worship, including the Sanctuary Choir and Chancel Ringers. New Spirit prelude at 8:20.

9:30 -- Contemporary Worship (Gym). Our Praise Band will express the joy of the resurrection with an expanded set of songs. The service will be close to an hour, but Children's Choir parents can depart as needed

9:00 - 11:00 -- Paschal Breakfast in Pierson Hall. The time span encompasses worshippers from all hours

10:30 -- Sanctuary Worship, including the Sanctuary Choir and Chancel Ringers. New Spirit prelude at 10:20

There will be regular Sunday School classes (except for adults) and Children's Choir rehearsal on Easter

Sunday, April 27 – **New sermon series begins**. I will being doing something I have never done before in a sermon series: I will be preaching a five-part series on a single Biblical story -- the story of Naaman in II Kings chapter 5. How can I preach for five weeks on one story, and a not so familiar story at that? It is a long story. But it is also a very intriguing story with fascinating characters and several key spiritual messages – and it is one of few Old Testament stories explicitly mentioned by Jesus in the gospels. The entire series, entitled, "*Healing Waters*," is outlined below.

Summer Camp

- Go to <u>www.eastohiocamps.org</u> and register online for the camp of your choice.
- Print the confirmation.
- Bring in a copy of the confirmation (or mail it) to our church office, PO Box 646, Kent, Ohio 44240 (specifically to Lynnette Begue, our financial coordinator). The church will send in a payment to the camp's office for half of the cost of your camp, and that office will bill you for the rest.

If you need further financial assistance, see Lynnette about receiving application materials for a District or Conference campership. It is possible to get nearly the entire cost of camp covered if you have the need.

Summer camp is a fun-filled time of spiritual growth and making new friends in God's great out-of-doors. For more information, speak with Dr. Palmer.
