Dear Friends,

One of the great strengths of our church is the *leadership* offered by many members of our congregation in numerous areas of service. In late June at a Church Conference meeting we approved the new slate of church leaders for the coming academic year. You will find the list posted on our web site under the leadership link. Click on the 2014-15 leadership directory to see the list of all the persons in our church who have agreed to be a part of various committees and ministry teams for the coming year. There are more than 200 names on this list, and it does not include people involved in our choirs, in our greeter or usher teams, in our Rotary or Lions lunch teams, in our Tuesday Work Group, in our teams who assemble mailings, or in our teams of Sunday School teachers or nursery caregivers. We have a great many people who are sharing their gifts in our church in many ways!

The apostle Paul wrote, "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." [I Corinthians 12:4-7]

We can rejoice in how the Holy Spirit is at work in all of us, to enable us to share together in God's purposes.

If you were contacted this spring by our Leadership Committee about serving on a committee and agreed to serve, you should find your name in the new leadership directory. Most of our committee members are serving three year terms. In the leadership directory, there is a year connected with each name, which indicates that that person's term concludes in the summer of that year. An asterisk next to a name indicates membership on the Church Council.


Our leadership positions begin in July of each year, so if you are coming new onto a committee, your term of service starts now! (The only exception is the Staff-Parish Committee, where new members start in the late fall; also the Leadership Committee does not meet until early spring). You will be notified of committee meetings *via e-mail* (please be sure that our church secretary has your e-mail address; you can send her your address by e-mailing her at erica@kentmethodist.org). There are also announcements of committee meeting dates in the Mosaic calendar. If you note an error in the Leadership Directory, please be in touch with our church office.

Those who have completed a term of service are listed in the 2013-14 leadership directory with the year 2014 attached to their name. Leadership terms ending in 2014 are completed at the end of June. Thanks to all who have served and who are rotating off of a leadership position.

Our leadership positions are in three year terms in order that we may have a continuous variety of persons in leadership. Some positions are required to be three year terms by the rule of our Methodist <u>Discipline</u> (the United Methodist rule book). We utilize the spiritual gift inventories that people fill out each year in order to try to identify people for particular areas of leadership; but if you have a specific interest, feel free to contact me or the church office!

In worship this month, the *summer sermon series on the Holy Spirit entitled "Catch the Wind"* continues each week. We rejoice in how the Holy Spirit is empowering so many people for leadership and service in our church!

One last song on June 19 and East Ohio Annual Conference faded away for another year. What remains? The results of business conducted, hearts full from meaningful worship, friendships made and renewed, individual resolve for a better future and HOPE for a United Methodist Church seeking to make disciples for Jesus Christ are all outcomes.

Officially 732 lay people and 795 clergy were delegates so Hoover Auditorium on the grounds of Lakeside was packed. Even in the sweltering heat of Tuesday, the faithful were sitting in their seats attending to the business of holy conferencing. You should be proud of our pastor, David Palmer, who chairs the Conference Council on Finance and Administration. Not only did he engage in the day to day

business during the year, he presented a concise, complete report with little or no reference to notes! Plus he fielded questions from the floor diplomatically. Not an easy task but he was superb.

Speaking of holy conferencing, Judith Nedel, a member of this church and a delegate-at-large was part of a hilarious but enlightening skit about how not to conduct church business. She was very funny as was the presentation. We got the point.

Behind the huge semi trailer parked outside Hoover Auditorium one could find Ed and Linda Clark and others collecting items for the Midwest Mission Distribution Center. Lest you think that is not a big job, here is the final list:

Youth Ministry News July 2014

Summer is a busy time for our youth and with the mission trip right around the corner I'd like to share with you about a new opportunity that our youth will have the opportunity to participate in "Day Camp." Many people ask or wonder just "What is Day Camp" so I'd like to take a moment to share a little about this wonderful opportunity.

Day Camp is a place to spread hope. It is an environment where children come to be loved and challenged in a safe and positive community.

Youth and adults spend a week with Grundy County children, 6-11 years old, participating in activities that take them on a journey throughout the county, learning about such things as the environment, community service, health, and local entrepreneurship.

Each day the children and volunteers have a devotional time where they talk about the theme for the day and work in their prayer journals. In this time volunteers have an opportunity to hear about the children's faith as well as share their own.

This county's story is usually told with grim statistics. 70% of all high school students are considered economically disadvantaged and only 7% go on to higher education. 25% of the county lives in what we would consider extreme poverty. Unemployment is typically 40% higher than the current national rate.

Through the unconditional love from volunteers and the variety of experiences they will have in their community, our hope is to teach resilience and to open their eyes to different possibilities and opportunities in their community.

As you can probably tell "Day Camp" is a very important and meaningful ministry. I am very excited for your youth to be able to participate in the program this year. I look forward even more to sharing with everyone in September testimonies from those who went to "change lives" and wound up changed themselves.
