#### Dear Friends,

Sometimes church life involves standing in a packed sanctuary on Easter morning, letting one's spirit soar with the singing of the Hallelujah Chorus.

Sometimes it involves standing in the clanging roar of the church boiler room, meeting with a heating systems engineer.

Both elements were a part of our overall church life during April.

At the end of April, our church Trustees approved a final proposal to implement a new church boiler system, bringing to completion a project toward which we have been working for the past several years. The new boiler plant has been ordered and will be installed after the present system is shut down in May.

The present 50-year-old system made it, barely, through the past winter. Special thanks to Walt Strawman for keeping this system going for the past years!

Along with the new boiler plant, we are installing a new building-wide controls system. New highefficiency boiler technology plus the new controls system will solve a number of major inefficiencies and problems that we had with the old system – saving gas costs and creating more comfortable meeting spaces.

The Boiler Subcommittee of our Trustees spent more than six months meeting with a variety of vendors, getting numerous bids and concepts and shaping the best possible final proposal. The project also includes a new maintenance contract.

Funding for the project comes from contributions through the "Turn Up the Heat" campaign (2011-2013), and the present Bicentennial Campaign, plus some additional funding from estate gifts. We are spending now what we anticipate will still be coming in through the Bicentennial Campaign, so those contributions are very important! A full financial report on the boiler project and the Bicentennial Campaign will be included in a summer issue of the Mosaic.

Turning to more inspirational matters – our Sunday worship! – I will be continuing a sermon series throughout the month entitled "Healing Waters," based upon the Biblical story of Naaman. Worship in May also features Communion on May 4, the "Festival of the Christian Home" -- Mother's Day! – on May 11, Confirmation on May 18, and a Memorial Day veterans' remembrance on May 25. I look forward to sharing with you, as we grow in our faith together.

To help enable young people to go to camp, our church will pay half the cost for any camper from our church for any one of our United Methodist camps. We call this financial assistance a "campership." To receive a campership, follow this process:

- Go to <u>www.eastohiocamps.org</u> and register online for the camp of your choice.
- Print the confirmation.

• Bring in a copy of the confirmation (or mail it) to our church office, PO Box 646, Kent, Ohio 44240 (specifically to Lynnette Begue, our financial coordinator). The church will send in a payment to the camp's office for half of the cost of your camp, and that office will bill you for the rest.

If you need further financial assistance, see Lynnette about receiving application materials for a District or Conference campership. It is possible to get nearly the entire cost of camp covered if you have the need.

There are many, many different types of camp experiences, and there are day camps and two-day overnight camps for the younger campers.

Summer camp is a fun-filled time of spiritual growth and making new friends in God's great out-of-doors. For more information, speak with Dr. Palmer or Julie Zeager.



# **Communion "Equipment" Changes – Volunteers Sought**

You may have noticed the recent change in our Communion cups, as we moved from glass to plastic. This enormously simplifies the cleanup process, as it is no longer necessary to wash and sterilize several hundred little cups. The used plastic cups are placed into a recycling bin.

We understand that some folks were reluctant to serve as Communion stewards because they did not relish the thought of cleaning all those cups! Now the job is much easier! We are in need of several new volunteers to be a 10:30 hour Communion steward on three or four Sundays a year. The task involves setting up the Communion elements (between 9:30 and 10:30), and then, with help from our confirmands who collect the cups from the rails, doing the brief cleanup afterwards.

If you would be willing to help in this way, please contact our church office via phone or e-mail, and someone will be in touch with more information.

Thanks to our head Communion steward, Becky Mulloy, who led this transition and was able to locate a new plastic cup design that performs well. Nearly twenty years ago, our church moved away from plastic cups into glass because the plastic cups at the time had a propensity to disintegrate when being pulled out of the tray – quite a mess! We have had no problems with the new cups.

We generally have Communion on the first Sunday of each month. In May, we also have Communion during the 10:30 service on Confirmation Sunday, as the confirmands serve Communion to the congregation.


## **Graduate Recognition**
