Hunger Network Ohio/ 2 Cents a Meal

"Speak up for the people who have no voice, for the rights of all the down-and-outers. Speak out for justice! Speak out for the poor and destitute! Proverbs 31: 8-9 from "The Message."

Hunger Network Ohio is a faith-based advocacy and networking organization. Their mission is "Motivated by faith, we work to end hunger in Ohio by networking with fellow advocates to engage public officials in creating policies that reduce poverty." There are a number of denominations including East and West Ohio Conferences of the UMC that have representatives on the board. HNO provides information on Ohio state policies and how we as citizens of Ohio can help make a difference in the lives of people who are struggling to live healthy, whole lives.

2 Cents-a-Meal is a way that all of us including children can help provide funding for HNO's work. The idea is that as we offer our thanksgiving for our food we can add 2 cents to a jar for those who might not have enough food. We have had canning jars marked 2 cents a meal by the Chapel and near the Sanctuary. We will be adding jars in the Sunday School Wing and by the Gymnasium for you to drop your donations in. 2 Cents-a-Meal is a way for the child in all of us to be part of the work to end hunger in Ohio. All those pennies and spare change add up and help so much.

Over the last few months, our church has collected \$161.20. Half of all money collected is sent to Hunger Network Ohio to help with their work and half stays in our community to help with hunger issues here. If you have any questions, please contact Judith Nedel.

Upcoming Book Discussions

God's Word on Human Sexuality: It's Not What Many Think! by David A. Palmer Tuesday, June 11 at 7 pm in the Conference Room

Various Christian traditions hold different attitudes regarding the inclusion of LGBTQ+ persons. Biblical verses are often quoted, but these are often "sloganized" and stripped of their context. In this book, Dr. Palmer reintroduces the historical and linguistic context of these verses so that readers can come to informed conclusions about what God is truly saying and how Christians can authentically live out the spirit of God's Word.

Rough Sleepers: Dr. Jim O'Connell's Urgent Mission to Bring Healing to Homeless People by Tracy Kidder Tuesday, August 6, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

When Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General Hospital, the chief of medicine made a proposal: Would he defer a prestigious fellowship and spend a year helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? That proposal turned into O'Connell's life's calling. In Rough Sleepers, Tracy Kidder travels with O'Connell as he navigates the city, offering medical care, socks, soup, empathy, humor, and friendship to some of the city's most vulnerable citizens—the "rough sleepers" who sleep on the streets. Along the way, he shows how one person can make a difference by creating a community of care.


Thank You Notes
