Mountain T.O.P. interest meeting September 29

Attention all third graders and their parents

As you enter the third grade this year, your church would like to present you with a very special gift -- your very own Bible. The Bible is one of the most wonderful gifts that the church can give, because it contains God's message of salvation!

Bible Presentation Sunday will be September 8 during the unified 10:00 a.m. service being planned for that day; third graders and their parents will be called to the front of the sanctuary to receive Bibles. The Book of Joy: Lasting Happiness in a Changing World by Dalai Lama XIV, Desmond Tutu, and Douglas Abrams

Tuesday, September 3, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

Nobel Peace Prize Laureates His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu have survived more than fifty years of exile and the soul-crushing violence of oppression. Yet, despite their hardships—or, as they would say, because of them—they have been two of the most joyful people on the planet. In April 2015, Archbishop Tutu traveled to the Dalai Lama's home to celebrate His Holiness' eightieth birthday and to create a gift for others, offering some of their hard-won, practical wisdom about living with joy in the face of life's inevitable suffering.

Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption by Bryan Stevenson

Tuesday, October 1, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

Bryan Stevenson was a young lawyer when he founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending those most desperate and in need: the impoverished, the wrongly condemned, and women and children trapped in the farthest reaches of our criminal justice system. Just Mercy is at once an unforgettable account of an idealistic young lawyer's coming of age, a moving window into the lives of those he has defended, and an inspiring argument for compassion in the pursuit of true justice.

Homegoing: A Novel by Yaa Gyasi

Tuesday, November 12, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

This 2017 novel tells the story of two sisters and their descendants through eight generations: from the coast of Ghana in the eighteenth century to the plantations of Mississippi, from the American Civil War to Jazz Age Harlem. Along the way, Gyasi's narrative illuminates slavery's troubling legacy, both for those who were taken and for those who stayed, and shows how the memory of captivity has been inscribed on the soul of our nation.
