Reign of Christ Sunday Sunday, November 24

Reign of Christ Sunday is one of the most recent additions to the Chrisitan calendar. Begun in 1925, the celebration was intended initially as a response to competing claims for our allegiance, especially as narrow ideologies and tribal nationalism was spreading across much of Europe following the First World War. Celebrated every year on the last Sunday of the Chrisitan year (before the new year begins on the First Sunday of Advent), Reign of Christ Sunday remains for us an essential opportunity to gather and reaffirm the primacy of God's call in our lives and throughout creation.

Upcoming Book Discussions

Homegoing: A Novel by Yaa Gyasi

Tuesday, November 12, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

This 2017 novel tells the story of two sisters and their descendants through eight generations: from the coast of Ghana in the eighteenth century to the plantations of Mississippi, from the American Civil War to Jazz Age Harlem. Along the way, Gyasi's narrative illuminates slavery's troubling legacy, both for those who were taken and for those who stayed, and shows how the memory of captivity has been inscribed on the soul of our nation.

Inciting Joy: Essays by Ross Gay

Tuesday, December 3, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

In these gorgeously written and timely pieces, poet and author Ross Gay considers the joy we incite when we care for each other, especially through life's hard moments. Throughout Inciting Joy, taking a cleareyed look at injustice, political polarization, and the destruction of the natural world, he explores how we might resist and how the study of joy might lead us to a wild, unpredictable, and unboundaried solidarity that will help us survive and do so with joy.
