



**Campaign for Compassion** A Five-Week Worship Series September 29 – October 27

Jesus taught that we should treat each other as we want others to treat us, including those with whom we disagree. Known as the "golden rule," a version of this teaching can be found in almost every religion in the world. This universal rule is a call to compassion and still has the power to reconcile and heal our divided world.

For five weeks this fall, leading up to the next national election on Tuesday, November 5, we will explore and recommit together to Jesus' teaching to "do unto others..." through five essential practices for building God's beloved community:

September 29: Justice—Our Shared Moral Vision October 6: Kindness—The Power of Doing Good October 13: Humility—Living on Common Ground October 20: Compassion—Loving Our Neighbors October 27: Advocacy—Our Political Responsibility

### Naming Our Commitments for 2025

This five-week worship series also will form the basis of our "Commitment Campaign" for 2025. In a season of division and animosity—perhaps not all that unlike our own—the prophet Micah wondered what God required of us and discerned this enduring response: ...to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God. These three practices—justice, kindness, and humility—provide a strong foundation for our work of reconciliation as we continue becoming and building God's beloved community. As we anticipate the coming year, you are encouraged to name your commitments to living Jesus' "golden rule" through these three practices and by participating in our life together as a community of deep faith and broad compassion.



### **Voter Registration and Information** Deadline to register or update registration is October 7

Voting is an important opportunity to be engaged in our community and to express our Christian faith. Taking an active stance in society is nothing new for followers of Christ in the way of John Wesley, who set the example for us to combine personal and social holiness. The grace of God calls us to be informed and involved with political and social realties; such public engagement is an expression of the personal change we experience in our baptism and in the Spirit's ongoing call.

If you are not yet registered to vote, have moved, or changed your name and want to vote in the November 5 General Election, you must register or update your registration no later than October 7. You can register to vote by going to www.voteohio.gov or any public library, bureau of motor vehicles, or board of elections. You can also register to vote, check the status of your registration, and find out what will be on your ballot by visiting www.vote411.org.

### **Upcoming Book Discussions**

#### Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption by Bryan Stevenson

### Tuesday, October 1, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

Bryan Stevenson was a young lawyer when he founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending those most desperate and in need: the impoverished, the wrongly condemned, and women and children trapped in the farthest reaches of our criminal justice system. Just Mercy is at once an unforgettable account of an idealistic young lawyer's coming of age, a moving window into the lives of those he has defended, and an inspiring argument for compassion in the pursuit of true justice.

#### Homegoing: A Novel by Yaa Gyasi Tuesday, November 12, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

This 2017 novel tells the story of two sisters and their descendants through eight generations: from the coast of Ghana in the eighteenth century to the plantations of Mississippi, from the American Civil War to Jazz Age Harlem. Along the way, Gyasi's narrative illuminates slavery's troubling legacy, both for those who were taken and for those who stayed, and shows how the memory of captivity has been inscribed on the soul of our nation.

### Inciting Joy: Essays by Ross Gay Tuesday, December 3, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

In these gorgeously written and timely pieces, poet and author Ross Gay considers the joy we incite when we care for each other, especially through life's hard moments. Throughout Inciting Joy, taking a cleareyed look at injustice, political polarization, and the destruction of the natural world, he explores how we might resist and how the study of joy might lead us to a wild, unpredictable, and unboundaried solidarity that will help us survive and do so with joy.


